COURSE OBJECTIVES:

Upon completion of the course, the student will be able to:

- 1. Utilize the knowledge of nursing theory and the scientific principles of pathophysiology, pharmacokinetics and pharmacotherapeutics in the assessment and management of health and acute or chronic illness in pediatric populations/families.
- 2. Implement health screenings, health promotion activities, anticipatory guidance, and a plan of care for pediatric populations/families based on clinical practice guidelines, current research, and individualized patient/family needs.
- 3. Incorporate information from the health history, physical examination, diagnostic tests, developmental status, and individualized health needs to formulate a database, identify differential diagnoses, and establish priorities of care for pediatric populations/families.
- 4. Develop a collaborative, dynamic plan of care for children/families utilizing on-going data collection and continual re-evaluation of the database, differential diagnoses, and priorities of care.
- 5. Implement a collaborative and comprehensive plan of care to maximize physical and mental health for pediatric populations/families.
- 6. Develop therapeutic interventions related to social, cultural, spiritual, bioethical, and economic factors affecting the health care of pediatric populations/families and underserved populations experiencing health, acute, and chronic illness.
- 7. Implement the role of the nurse practitioner to influence health policy, improve quality health care, and promote access to care for pediatric populations/families and underserved populations.
- 8. Collaborate with other health professionals to deliver evidence-based, safe, and cost-efficient health care to children and their families.
- 9. Maintain standards of professional behavior and accountability in the implementation of the Nurse Practitioner role.
